





THE BOTTOM LINES II

- DEMOCRATS PICKED UP TWO <u>U.S. SENATE</u> SEATS AND ARE STILL CONTENDING FOR A THIRD BUT REPUBLICANS WILL RETAIN CONTROL, PROBABLY BY A FILIBUSTERABLE 52-48
- DEMOCRATS PICKED UP A NET OF SIX SEATS IN THE <u>U.S. HOUSE</u>; TWO SEATS ARE UNDECIDED. REPUBLICANS WILL RETAIN NUMERICAL CONTROL (IT'S CURRENTLY 239-194) BUT HAVE TO CONTEND WITH A SOMETIMES UNRULY RANK-AND-FILE

THE BOTTOM LINES III

- REPUBLICANS ADDED A NET OF TWO GOVERNORS AND NOW HOLD MORE GOVERNORSHIPS THAN THEY HAVE SINCE 1922
- REPUBLICANS GAINED THREE STATE-LEGISLATIVE CHAMBERS AND LOST FOUR; THEY CONTROL 68 OF THE 99



The wealth of US families increased from 1983 to 2007, but has fallen sharply Since then. The median net worth of families, in 2014 dollars.








Public Trust in Government: 1958-2015










"Which ONE of these four candidate qualities mattered most in deciding how you voted for President?"

QUICKLY WINNOWED TO TWO


- CLINTON WON 34 STATES, INCLUDING THE NINE MOST POPULOUS, RECEIVING 16.9 MILLION VOTES

- HE CONCEDED BEFORE THE CONVENTION







Here's one huge clue from the summer: Don't discount the Trump message. It resonates.






Barack Obama: Job Approval






Makeup of Electorate






Presidential Vote by Party

WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE? 1. GOVERNANCE

- 93% OF AMERICANS WANT THE PARTIES TO WORK TOGETHER
- BUT THE REPUBLICAN PARTY IS SPLIT AMONG TRADITIONAL CONSERVATIVES, ESTABLISHMENTARIANS, "REFORMICONS" AND TRUMPIAN POPULISTS

 - ENDING THE CARRIED INTEREST TAX BREAK



What's next for Democrats?

WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE? THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY

- THE IMMEDIATE FUTURE (THE 2018 ELECTIONS) DOESN'T LOOK GOOD
 - TURNOUT AMONG DEMOCRATIC VOTERS TYPICALLY DECLINES PRECIPITOUSLY IN MID-TERM ELECTIONS
 - IN 2018 DEMOCRATS WILL HAVE TO DEFEND 23 SEATS PLUS 2 OF NON-DEMOCRATS WHO CAUCUS WITH THEM; REPUBLICANS ARE DEFENDING 8
 - TEN OF THE DEMOCRATIC-HELD SEATS ARE IN STATES TRUMP WON
 - INCOMPLETE INFORMATION: THERE ARE MORE DEMOCRATIC HOUSE MEMBERS REPRESENTING DISTRICTS TRUMP WON THAN REPUBLICANS REPRESENTING DISTRICTS CLINTON WON

THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY II

- THE PROGRESSIVES ARE FURIOUS: THEY BLAME TRUMP'S VICTORY ON THE CORPORATIST DEMOCRATS
- THEY WANT A GREATER SAY IN CONGRESSIONAL LEADERSHIP
 - A LITTLE-KNOWN CHALLENGER TO HOUSE MINORITY LEADER PELOSI RECEIVED A THIRD OF THE VOTE
 - IN RESPONSE TO PRESSURE FROM PROGRESSIVES, SENATE MINORITY LEADER SCHUMER GAVE SANDERS AND WARREN LEADERSHIP POSTS

THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY III

- THE PROGRESSIVES WANT PURGES
 - OF THE DNC
 - OF INCUMBENT CONGRESSMEN AND SENATORS IN 2018 PRIMARIES
 - SANDERS HAS ENDORSED THIS
- THEY'RE WILLING TO COOPERATE WITH TRUMP ON COMMON GOALS

THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY IV

- THE ESTABLISHMENT WING WILL FIGHT BACK
- THEY'RE TOTALLY IN DENIAL
- SOME PROGRESSIVES ARE ADVOCATING LEAVING THE PARTY IF THEY DON'T GET THE CHANGES THEY SEEK

THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY V

• WILL IT STICK WITH IDENTITY POLITICS?

WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE? THE BLUE-COLLAR UNIONS

- THERE'S A FUNDAMENTAL CONFLICT BETWEEN THEIR GOALS AND THE GOALS OF THE ENVIRONMENTALISTS
- THERE'S ALSO A FUNDAMENTAL CONFLICT BETWEEN THEIR GOALS AND THE PRINCIPLES OF CONSERVATIVE REPUBLICANISM
 - RIGHT-TO-WORK LAWS
 - PREVAILING-WAGE LAWS
 - USE OF COMPULSORY UNION DUES FOR POLITICAL PURPOSES

THE BLUE-COLLAR UNIONS II

- THEIR CHOICE IS BETWEEN
 - BEING TREATED AS MINOR ROYALTY BY DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATES AND PARTY OFFICIALS
 - AND RETAINING THE ALLEGIANCE OF THEIR MEMBERS
- WILL TRUMP ACTIVELY COURT THEM?
