### **DIVISION SNAPSHOT**



- ► This year, ACPS is serving our 13,981 PK-12 students with a staff of 1,313 teachers and 1,258 classified employees at 25 Schools (15 elementary; 6 middle; 4 HS).
- ▶ There are three STEM academies in the division.
- 9.7% of our students are identified as English Learners; 29.5% are eligible for free and reduced price meals; 12.5% are served by Special Education; and 9.8% are identified as Gifted.
- Our students were born in 89 countries and speak 74 home languages.
- Each day, our school cafeterias serve more than 8,000 meals, and our buses travel 14,384 miles.




